AIA Arkansas recognizes achievements



EMERGING PROFESSIONAL AWARD

CANDICE ADAMS, AIA, LEED AP, of Little Rock, received the 2010 Emerging Professional Award.

Adams graduated with high honors and a Bachelor of Architecture from the Fay Jones School of Architecture at the University of Arkansas in 2004. Adams has worked with AIA Arkansas since 2005 as an advocate for intern architects both statewide and regionally, serving two terms as associate director. She currently serves the chapter as coordinator of its Intern Development Program.

Adams has embraced her role as an advocate for interns and newly licensed architects. Her goal is to improve the intern experience while making



it an educational tool and encouraging interns to embrace the sometimes vigorous licensing process. Her efforts on their behalf entice wavering interns to consider architecture in Arkansas as a long-term career choice.

Adams's work with Polk Stanley

Wilcox Architects to integrate Intern Development Program standards into everyday practice was recognized by the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards, which named Polk Stanley one of two outstanding IDP firms in the country in 2009.

AWARD OF MERIT

SHARON PRIEST, executive director of the Downtown Little Rock Partnership, received the 2010 Award of Merit.

Under Priest's leadership, the DLRP has worked to expand the River Market District along President Clinton Avenue and spur commercial development along Main Street. In addition, Priest leads the MacArthur Park Group, a grass-roots organization of interested stakeholders that created an award-winning master plan for the downtown park.

Priest's public-service career began in 1986 when she was elected to the Little Rock Board of Directors. She was elected to serve as vice-mayor in 1991 and mayor in 1991.

In 1994, Priest became the first woman elected to serve as Arkansas secretary of state, and



she served for two terms. She was selected to serve as president of the National Association of Secretaries of State in 2000, and after that year's presidential election, testified before U.S. House and Senate committees on election reform.

As secretary of state, she restored the Governor's Reception Room and the old Supreme Court Chamber at the State Capitol to their original splendor, and

restored the Capitol's rotunda marble.

Priest serves on the board of the Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis and has served on the Premier Election Solutions board, the BP Independent Safety Review Panel and the Carter-Baker Commission on Election Reform. Locally, she is a past member of the board at Good Shepherd Ecumenical Retirement Center.

FAY JONES GOLD MEDAL

STEVE L. KINZLER, AIA, of Polk Stanley Wilcox Architects of Little Rock, received the 2010 Fay Jones Gold Medal.

The award recognizes an individual architect who demonstrates touchstones of excellence through artistic vision and design, leadership and service to the State of Arkansas and the AIA Arkansas Chapter. Excellence is measured not only by the mark of architectural and individual achievement, but through the esteem and regard held for the architect by professional practitioners and the community as a whole.

The Gold Medal Award is aptly named after the late Fay Jones, FAIA, whose work encompasses and embodies all the qualities AIA Arkansas admires in an architect and a person. It represents his excellence as well as those who receive this prestigious award.

A respected representative of his profession in his community and state, Kinzler has made significant contributions to society and the practice of architecture for more than 37 years. Kinzler joined the firm of Blass, Chilcote, Carter, Lanford & Wilcox Architects in 1974 as a project architect and was later named an associate. In 1989, he co-founded what became Wilcox Group Architects, which he ultimately served as CEO for 10 years.

As part of a 2009 merger with Polk Stanley Rowland Curzon Porter Architects, the Polk Stanley Wilcox firm was born with Kinzler serving as president and COO of the 40-person firm.



Kinzler has served as AIA Arkansas Convention Committee chair three times and in multiple other roles as a committee member or chair. He helped form the chapter awards program that includes the Arkansas chapter's Fay Jones Gold Medal Award and helped establish the structure of the chapter's board positions, including the formation of chapter sections. He helped establish the trade-show funding source for allied professionals that was the forerunner to the current Allied members program.

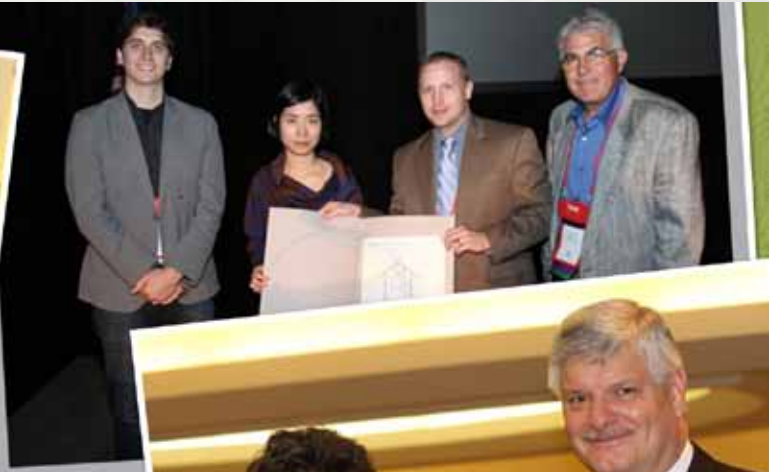
Kinzler is a member of the University of Arkansas Fay Jones School of Architecture Advisory Board and is president of its Dean's Circle. He co-founded in 2002 the Camp Aldersgate Design-Build Studio for first- and second-year UA architecture students. His guidance with his firm's Intern Development Program led to its receiving one of just two Intern Development Program Outstanding Firm Awards in the nation in 2009.

Kinzler's most significant

architectural projects include the College of Public Health at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, the new Customer Service and Technical Support Center for Hewlett-Packard in Conway, the new Little Rock campus for Fellowship Bible Church, Boy Scout camp facilities at the Gus Blass Scout Reservation in Damascus, and numerous projects for Arkansas Children's Hospital.

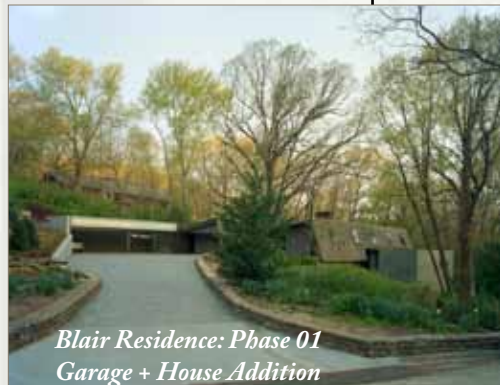

Crystal Bridges to open 11/11/11

Crystal Bridges Museum of American Art announced its opening date as November 11, 2011.



The glass, concrete, and wood building design by world-renowned architect Moshe Safdie features a series of pavilions divided by two

spring-fed ponds. The museum totals 217,000 square feet of usable space with six galleries, a museum store, library, dining, classroom space, and a great hall.

The campus rests in 120 acres of forest, and the museum takes its name from a nearby natural spring and the bridge incorporated in the design. Visitors will experience not only the museum, but also a series of urban trails peppered with interactive sculpture and gardens connecting the campus to downtown Bentonville.

Nestled in the foothills of the Ozarks in Bentonville, Crystal Bridges Museum of American Art will house a permanent collection of masterworks of American art ranging from the colonial period to contemporary work. Furthermore, a changing array of special exhibitions will feature art from museums and collections throughout the region, the nation and abroad.

Shannon selected for honor

Jeff Shannon, dean of the Fay Jones School of Architecture, was chosen as one of the 25 “most admired educators” of 2011 in the November/December issue of *DesignIntelligence*.

“Each year, *DesignIntelligence* selects a team of educators and education administrators who exemplify excellence in design education leadership,” the issue states. “The 2011 class of education role models was selected by *DesignIntelligence* staff with extensive input from hundreds of design professionals, academic department heads and students. Educators from the disciplines of architecture, interior design, industrial design and landscape architecture were eligible for inclusion.”

DesignIntelligence is a bi-monthly report of the Design Futures Council, described as “an interdisciplinary network of design, product and construction leaders exploring global trends, challenges, and opportunities to advance innovation and shape the future of the industry and the environment.”

Dan Bennett, former dean of the University of Arkansas school of architecture and current dean at Auburn University’s College of Architecture, Design and Construction, was also listed among the 25 top professors and education leaders.

Shannon has devoted most of his career to practicing and teaching architecture in his native Arkansas. He began his career working in the firm of school alumnus and professor Fay Jones, and later worked at firms in Memphis, Houston, Palm Beach and Little Rock. In 1977, he co-founded Polk Shannon Stanley in Little Rock, which has since become one of the state’s leading architecture firms: Polk Stanley Wilcox Architects. In 1979, Shannon returned to his alma mater to teach architecture.

Shannon has won numerous teaching awards, notably the Master Teaching Award (1993) and Outstanding Teacher Award (1997), both from the school of architecture, and the University of Arkansas Teaching Academy Award for Outstanding Teaching in the Category of Creativity (1992). He was inducted into the University of Arkansas Teaching Academy in 1993.

As dean of the architecture school since 2000, he has developed new programs to foster leadership and life skills among students and to enhance diversity within the school. He continues to teach popular courses on the history of urban form and design thinking. He is also the executive editor and founder of the publishing collaboration between the school and the University of Arkansas Press, which began in 2009.

Shannon has published numerous articles in scholarly publications and serves on the boards of the Arkansas State Board of Architects, the Arkansas Chapter of the American Institute of Architects and the Winthrop Rockefeller Institute.

He graduated *cum laude* with a bachelor of architecture from the University of Arkansas and holds a master of architecture in urban design from Rice University.
