Peter Bohlin, FAIA, calls himself a “soft modernist.” Others describe his approach to architecture as human and enabling, its aesthetic based upon “a quiet rigor which is both intellectual and intuitive.” Bohlin, the head of Bohlin Cywinski Jackson (BCJ) takes pride in the collegial culture of the firm he founded in 1965 in Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania. With additional offices in Pittsburgh, Philadelphia, Seattle and San Francisco, it now employs 200 people.

The firm has worked on a range of projects in settings natural and manmade. Celebrated for dealing with the varied needs and circumstances of its many clients, BCJ has been the recipient of more than 500 regional, national and international awards. Bohlin and his firm are credited with the design of the flagship APPLE stores here and abroad.

In 2010 Bohlin was the recipient of the American Institute of Architects’s Gold Medal, the profession’s highest honor “given to an individual whose significant body of work has had a lasting influence on the theory and practice of architecture.”
